WHAT PROGRAMS?

There are two programs:

Level I. The **Mathematics and Science Program** is for students entering grades 8, 9, and 10, who have had at least pre-algebra mathematics.

Students study:

- Mathematics in the Real World
- Computer Science
- Environmental Science

WHEN?

Level I program runs from July 2, 2007 to August 3, 2007. The program is scheduled for Monday–Friday from 9:00 AM–3:00 PM.

COSTS?

The cost for students admitted into Level I program is \$600 for the entire program.

Level II. The **Mathematics, Science, and Computer Programming** is for students entering grades 10, 11, and 12 who have had at least Algebra I and Algebra II, or Precalculus.

Students study:

- Bridge to Abstract Mathematics
- Computer Science
- Environmental Science

WHEN?

Level II program runs from July 2, 2007 to August 10, 2007. The program is scheduled for Monday–Friday from 9:00 AM–3:00 PM.

ADMISSION AND COSTS

Students accepted into the Level II program will be supported by the dual credit agreement between USF and the counties involved. Students applying to the program must provide a consent statement from their school counselor to enroll in Bridge to Abstract Mathematics MGF 3301. The fee is approximately \$20 for the entire program.

COURSE CREDIT

Students completing the Level II program successfully will receive four (4) college credits from the University of South Florida.

FOCUS

Both programs will involve the students in classroom activities focusing on problem solving and hands-on laboratory activities.

WHERE ARE THE PROGRAMS HELD?

The programs all take place on the Tampa campus of the University of South Florida

DOES A STUDENT HAVE TO BE THERE THE ENTIRE PROGRAM?

Yes. These are intense programs so that a student is allowed only two excused absences.

WHO ARE THE INSTRUCTORS?

The instructors in the programs are faculty and staff from the College of Arts and Sciences at USF. All have experience working with secondary school students and many have over twenty years experience teaching these programs.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

These programs are open to high achieving students who are from local counties and who meet the State of Florida criteria for gifted and/or have demonstrated appropriate outstanding academic achievement.
